Isaiah 43:18-19




In a time of swift and varied changes, St Peter's Church is maturing into a community where all people can encounter God's embrace. We seek to do this through our various food ministries, support of our neighbors in need, our growing ministry of refugee resettlement, and through regional collaboration in faith formation, children and youth ministry and outreach.

In all that we do, we hope to extend God's embrace beyond our walls so that all may know that God is making all things new.

OUR GOALS

PRESERVATION

Although individual projects have been commissioned through the years to improve the external appearance of our grounds, we have needed a landscape master plan to address larger structural issues such as stormwater management, erosion, mature trees, stairways and retaining walls.

GATHERING

The pandemic highlighted that we do not have an outdoor gathering space. Such a space would allow us to extend church services, celebrations, and events beyond our walls and into the community.

ACCESSIBILITY

A new ramp from the parking lot to the terrace will enable access to the church's lower level (undercroft and Academy for Children).

WELCOMING

The structural improvements will make it clear to visitors and passersby that our exterior space is open to all to have casual and daily interaction as a meeting place and a place for rest and contemplation.

BEAUTY

May all who see our grounds know that God is about the work of renewal, and when we enter God's embrace, beauty is reborn.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

How long do I have to make my pledge?

Pledges are payable over three years. While many pay their pledge in a year one payment, any variation over three years is acceptable. Most pay in three equal installments.

Can I make a pledge after the campaign is over?

The active phase of the campaign will end in the Spring of 2023. However, pledges are accepted at any time.

Can I change my pledge?

While you can change your pledge at any time, please remember that we are basing our entire renovation project on the funds we have available to spend.

Is there a guideline of how much to pledge?

St. Peter's wants you to pray about your gift, and then be comfortable with your decision. Some outside sources indicate that a pledge should be three times your annual operating pledge, payable over three years.

Is giving mutual funds or stocks encouraged?

Yes, it would be appropriate to gift investments. We can talk directly with anyone who would like to make such an arrangement and guide you through the process.

OUR NEEDS

The anticipated total cost of the project is estimated at \$400,000.

Full participation of St. Peter's member and friends – both local and far-flung – is our #1 fundraising goal. Significant leadership gifts will be sought, but we will need each and every household to participate in whatever way they can to push us over the finish line.

Pledges to the fundraising campaign will be payable over a three year period from 2023 to 2025.
